DANCING ALONG THE PATH

During the eclipse, capture a video of yourself, or you with others.



Do you have an artistic nature?



Selfies are a great way to tell your friends that YOU WERE THERE! The August 21, 2017 eclipse will be observable on four continents. Where will you be? Do NOT look directly at the Sun or through your camera's finder.)



PREDICT THE CORONA ART CONTEST

What do you predict the corona will look like for the August 21, 2017 eclipse?

Before the advent of photography, astronomers tried very hard to sketch the fleeting shape of our Sun's outer atmosphere called the corona. This ghostly halo of light had been seen for centuries by naked-eye observers at the height of most total solar eclipses, but little was known in the 1800s about its shape and extent or how these changed with time. On April 8, 2024 there will be another total solar eclipse visible across the continental United States.
